# What is PsycINFO?

- **PsycINFO is a database from the American Psychological Association (APA.) It provides access to international literature in psychology, cognitive science, and related disciplines. Coverage is from 1840-present.**
- **Included are citations and abstracts to over 1,800 professional journals, books, chapters, reports, theses and dissertations, published internationally. This material is indexed by Descriptors (subject headings.)**
- **Many journal articles are available online (full-text) while many others are available in print owned by the UCSD libraries. (Some journals are available in both formats.)**
- **Many books and chapters are owned by the UCSD libraries.**

# What is PsycARTICLES?

- **PsycARTICLES is a full-text database from the American Psychological Association. It provides the full-text of articles for approximately 50 journals. Coverage begins in 1985, unless otherwise noted.**
- **PsycARTICLES does not index by Descriptors (subject headings) however, the journals included in PsycARTICLES are indexed by Descriptors in PsycINFO; therefore, search PsycINFO to retrieve results from both databases.**
- **You can search by author, title, keywords or browse specific issues of journals in PsycARTICLES.**

## RECORDS and FIELDS

Each record is comprised of many fields: title, author, source, descriptors, abstracts, publication type, identifiers, etc. (record continued on next slide.)

**Abstract** Self-reflection, typically operationalized in scales of **egocentrism** and introspectiveness, is portrayed as problematic in much of the literature on adolescents. Self-reflection has been linked to dysfunctional self-consciousness, symptomatology, and risk behaviors. Yet, self-reflection also is seen as essential for adolescent development, particularly with respect to individuation and identity. In this exploratory study, the authors focused on the process of self-reflecting. From interviews with 10 students conducted over the first 2 university years, the authors longitudinally assessed and then evaluated self-reflecting patterns in relationship to a narrative analysis of developmental change. Students who showed evidence of developmental change or sustained engagement in developmental work over the study period devoted a higher percentage of their interview conversation to self-reflecting content. Differences in self-reflecting patterning over time among the students who showed developmental change further suggest linkages between

## **DESCRIPTOR vs. KEYWORD SEARCHING**

### **What is a descriptor?**

A descriptor is a subject heading. It describes the subject content of a record. Descriptors are assigned to each record in PsycINFO.

### **What does a descriptor search do?**

A descriptor search only searches the Descriptor field of a record. Descriptors (subject headings) describe the subject of a record; therefore, descriptor searching is the most focused way of searching for a particular subject.

## DESCRIPTOR vs. KEYWORD SEARCHING

## DESCRIPTOR vs. KEYWORD SEARCHING

For a **Descriptor** search the database only searches the **Descriptors** field of a record. This particular record is about egocentrism, and brain, cognitive processes, etc.

**Abstract** In addition to modulating memory per se, estrogen alters the learning strategy used to solve a task, thereby regulating the quality of information processed by the brain. This review discusses estrogen's actions on cognition within a memory systems framework, highlighting our work with a variety of paradigms showing that learning strategy is sensitive to estrogen even when learning rate is not. Specifically, high levels of gonadal steroids, in particular, elevations in estrogen, bias female rats toward using hippocampal-sensitive approaches while low levels of gonadal steroids promote the use of non-hippocampal sensitive strategies. In light of findings from a variety of approaches involving the hippocampus in allocentric and the striatum in egocentric response patterns, it is likely that estrogen alters the relative participation of these, and most undoubtedly other, neural systems during cognition. Changes in neuromodulators such as acetylcholine that regulate other processes such as inhibitory tone and excitability reflect one mechanism by which estrogen may

## **DESCRIPTOR vs. KEYWORD SEARCHING**

### **What is a keyword?**

A keyword is a term you can search.

### **What does a keyword search do?**

A keyword search searches four different fields of a record: Title, Abstract, Descriptor, and Identifier (if the record contains an Identifier field.) If the term appears in any one of these fields the database will retrieve it. Some records will be relevant, others will not.

## DESCRIPTOR vs. KEYWORD SEARCHING

Below is an example of a **Keyword** search, **egocentrism**; it retrieved 1057 results, 313 more records than the **Descriptor** search.

For a **Keyword** search the database searches four different fields of a record: Title, Abstract, Descriptor, and Identifier (if the record contains an Identifier field.) **Definitions:**

**Hierarchy** - displays all terms that have relationships with the found item (eg, broader and narrower terms) plus any explanatory notes; enter a word or phrase to search the hierarchies.

**Rotated Index** - displays all terms that contain the found single word, plus related terms; enter a single word to search.

**Alphabetical List** - displays a list of main terms with no indication of relationships; enter a word or phrase to search the alphabetical list.

## THESAURUS LOOK UPS

**Memory loss** is not listed; but there is another descriptor that we can use: **Memory decay**. Click on that descriptor.

## THESAURUS LOOK UPS

**Senior citizens** was not found as a descriptor. PsycINFO categorizes populations by age groups in a different field code called Age. Remember if your research includes an age group such as children, adults, etc. do not search the thesaurus; instead check the Age Index. To see the Age Index click on Indexes.

Now that you have your **descriptor** and your **age** you are ready to conduct your **Advanced Search**. Click on **Advanced Search**.



If not owned by the UCSD Libraries, request it through Interlibrary Loan.**

# PsycARTICLES TIPS

- **PsycARTICLES provides the full-text of articles for approximately 50 journals. Coverage begins in 1985, unless otherwise noted.**
- **PsycARTICLES does not index by Descriptors, therefore you cannot search by subjects. However, the journals in PsycARTICLES are also included and indexed by Descriptors (subject headings) in PsycINFO; therefore, search PsycINFO to retrieve results from both databases.**
- **You can search by author, title, keywords or browse specific issues of journals in PsycARTICLES.**
