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What is PsycINFO?

- PsycINFO is a database from the American Psychological Association (APA.) It provides access to international literature in psychology, cognitive science, and related disciplines. Coverage is from 1840-present.
- Included are citations and abstracts for over 1,800 professional journals, books, chapters, reports, theses and dissertations, published internationally. This material is indexed by Descriptors (subject headings.)
- Many journal articles are available online (full-text) while many others are available in print owned by the UCSD libraries. (Some journals are available in both formats.)
- Many books and chapters are owned by the UCSD libraries.

What is PsycARTICLES?

- PsycARTICLES is a full-text database from the American Psychological Association. It provides the full-text of articles from 53 journals. Coverage begins in 1985, unless otherwise noted.
- PsycARTICLES does not index by Descriptors (subject headings) however, the journals are indexed by Descriptors in PsycINFO; therefore, search PsycINFO to retrieve results from both databases.
- You can search by author, title, keywords or browse specific issues of journals in PsycARTICLES.

THESAURUS LOOK UPS

According to the thesaurus **language development** is a **Descriptor**.

Descriptor searching is more precise than keyword searching, but if your term is not listed as a **descriptor**, search your term as a **keyword**. You can conduct searches using both **descriptors** and **keywords**.

Now that you have your **descriptors** you are ready to conduct your **Advanced Search**. Return to the already opened PsycINFO window and click on **Advanced Search**.

Now that you have your **descriptors** and your **population** you are ready to conduct your **Advanced Search**. Return to the already opened PsycINFO window and click on **Advanced Search**.

Population, PO=

Population contains a standardized description of specific populations related to the content of the document. These include: human, animal, male, female, inpatient, outpatient.

To search a specific population, enter the word, e.g.:

po=(female)

To search age groups, it is only necessary to use the name of the age group, e.g.:

po=(school age)

This can be combined with the specific population, e.g.:

po=(school age and female)

Select **Descriptors (DE=)** from the second drop-down menu and type in **language development**.

Limit to **Journal Articles Only**.

This paper reports a normative study on the phonological **development** of British English-speaking children. Speech samples of 684 children, aged between 3;0 and 6;11 years, randomly selected from nurseries and schools in eight different areas throughout the UK, were collected and analysed to obtain normative data. 

- Full-text University of California (UC) dissertations from 1997-present and abstracts for all other dissertations from 1980-present are included in the Digital Dissertations database. For a dissertation from an institution outside of the UC, check the ROGER Catalog to find out if the library owns a copy. If not owned by the UCSD Libraries, request it through Interlibrary Loan.
